Leadership Changes for Boston City Council & School Committee

City Council re-elects President while School Committee elects a new Chair

On January 7, 2013, the first Monday of the year, the Boston City Council unanimously reelected Councilor Stephen Murphy to a third consecutive one-year term as President. The City Council had previously approved a rules change that increased the President's term to two consecutive years starting in January 2014. That left a one-year term to fill and the members chose to continue Councilor Murphy's term as President in 2013.

School Committee

On January 8, 2013, the School Committee unanimously elected Michael O'Neill as Chairperson to replace outgoing Rev. Gregory Groover who served as Chairperson for the past four years. Mr. O'Neill previously served as Vice Chair of the School Committee in 2012. He is Vice President of Marketing and Distribution of the Savings Bank Life Insurance Company (SBLI) of Massachusetts. He is the Board Chair of the Boston Private Industry Council's Youth Council. On December 31, Mayor Menino appointed him to a second four-year term on the School Committee.

The Committee also selected Alfreda Harris to be the new Vice Chairperson. Mrs. Harris has been a member of the School Committee since 1993 and had previously served as Vice Chairperson during five of her almost 20 years on the Board. She is a consultant at Legacy Consultants.
